

Listen to the Word

16<sup>th</sup> April 2023 Acts 2: 42-47 | Psalm 117 | 1 Peter 1: 3-9 | John 20: 19-31 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Easter

We are moving from the season of Lent and the period of Passiontide and embarking on a new journey: a paschal journey with the early church, and an opportunity to re-discover the meaning of Community. Each year we seem to reach this point either exhausted by the intensity of the past seven weeks or exhilarated, ready for a joyous journey through the Easter season reinvigorated by our shared experiences. The early church could have hidden from view after the traumatic events of the last week but, filled with the spirit of God, they began to build, and so must we. We are faced with many problems but we should follow the example of the early church and aim to build not decline.

In today's passage from Acts we meet a vibrant community, working together, teaching each other, sharing their resources to build a church worthy to be called the Church of Christ. This period of activity made a deep impression on those who saw it. Many were drawn to the community because they could see the many acts of kindness, of healing, they had witnessed. This was a community, built on the love of Christ, united by the eucharist, the breaking of bread, and ready to proclaim Christ's message to the world.

Peter writes perhaps twenty years after this explosion of faith and joy that formed the early church. Over the coming weeks we dip into the treasury of his letters to the emerging, growing, communities building up the Body of Christ. His message today is as real and present as it would have been to the communities that received it all those years ago. It is powerful, assuring us that even though we live in difficult times we are held in the arms of our God who will guard and protect us.

John, we believe, was present in the room when Jesus appeared among His disciples. He is our witness to these events. Christ's appearance fills them with joy. The peace of Christ comes upon them to assure them that all will be well, and He gives them a mission: He sends them out to do His work in the world. They will not be alone; the Sprit will be with them, to guide, inspire, and protect them. Even those who are not present, like Thomas, will come to believe in Him. This message is passed on to us today. We are His disciples, we are sent into the world to speak of His love, and "*believing this we may have life through His name*."
