Important reminders regarding school expectations

Sickness & Diarrhoea

A reminder - if your child has sickness or diarrhoea, they must be absent from school for 48 hours after the last episode. Medication

If your child needs medication, either prescribed or over the counter, school can administer this. Forms need to be completed and <u>all medication must be handed into and collected from</u> the school office by an adult. If your child needs to bring medication into school e.g. they are going to grandparents' house after school (but we don't need to administer it) this must again be handed into/collected from the office by an adult. Children must not have medication in their school bag.

Holidays during term time

We are seeing an increase in holiday requests during term time. Taking children out of school has an impact on learning and we would ask that you avoid term time holidays whenever possible. A leave of absence application form must be completed for any holiday request.
