Dear Families

Here we are, steamrolling towards the end of the academic year with only a half term to go! We have had a busy few weeks - celebrating the King's Coronation as well as completing the Year 6 and Year 2 SATs. Thank you, to all staff who have guided pupils through these assessments enabling everyone involved to remain as calm and relaxed as possible. You will have seen in press coverage, across the country, that some of these assessments proved tricky, but we know all our pupils will have given their best and that, of course, is all we could ever ask.

When we return, our Y1 pupils, and some Y2s, will be involved in the phonics screening assessment and our Y4 pupils will show off their skills in the multiplication assessment. We encourage you to make the most of your week off but, where pupils, or parents, have been given extra advice, we encourage you to find time to work on skills for 10-15 minutes a day.

Multiply Programme

Durham County Council are offering help to any residents who are struggling with maths, as part of the Multiply programme. Multiply is a new government-funded programme to help adults improve their numeracy skills. The programme is aimed at anyone aged 19 and over who doesn't have maths GCSE at grade C. They can access free numeracy courses through Multiply to build their confidence with numbers and may opt to go on and gain a qualification. Those children whose parents take an active interest in their maths are more likely to succeed and less likely to develop negative attitudes towards maths. Good numeracy skills, or even just increased confidence with numbers, will allow parents to help children with homework and foster positive attitudes.
