**Dear Families** 

#### SCHOOL MEAL CHARGES, September 2023

I write with important news about changes to the school meals service in St Joseph's. We know that times are hard right now financially. We are all dealing with unprecedented cost inflation at home and it's no different for our schools. The huge cost increases we are experiencing across our supermarkets means that all our school kitchens are faced with them too from our suppliers.

Food inflation is at an all-time high, at around 30%, and with global supply issues this isn't likely to change in the near future. We have tried really hard to minimise any impact to our families and communities and will continue to review our costs and menus to provide affordable choices.

Unfortunately, the increases are simply too big for the school to cover and therefore in September school meal prices will be increased to £2.65 per day from £2.40 per day, for pupils in KS2, and £3.18 from £2.88 for nursery pupils, we've tried so hard to keep costs as low as possible so can reduce that increase to just £1.25 and £1.50 per week. We are doing our utmost to minimise the impact to you and although our costs have increased by 30% we are only increasing school meals by 10%. The remaining 20% increase is being covered by the school budget, however the school is not receiving any additional income from the DfE to cover the cost of school meals.

Our wonderful Catering Teams do everything we can to make 'school dinner time' as enjoyable as possible and we are constantly considering our menu choices. All of our menus are fully compliant with the government's School Food Plan. All of our Catering Teams will ensure that all children have a popular and healthy meal choice every day, with options to meet the needs of all age groups and those with notified special dietary requirements.
