Safeguarding Questionnaire

As you know, we have asked all our families to complete a safeguarding questionnaire. We currently have 58 responses. We are extending the closing date for this until the end of half term so that as many people as possible can complete the survey. We have also shared a child friendly safeguarding policy with our pupils so they know how to keep themselves safe and know that adults are always available in school should they have any concerns.

Lockdown

We conducted an initial lockdown practice this week. We will repeat this, along with fire drills, at various points during the year. Each time, we carry out a drill, we concentrate on a different focus to be as efficient as possible.

Buildings Update

Contractors have visited school to complete further assessments in response to the recent flood damage. They plan to return in the coming weeks, when it will be necessary to dig into the concrete flooring at different points around school. From there, we will work with the Estates team at BWCET to formulate the plan for remedial works. The intention is to carry out the work in sections so that school will be fully operational, although there may be some changes to classrooms and some areas will be restricted. We will, as ever, keep you updated. As we are still in a position of uncertainty, we are not able to introduce after school clubs yet. We encourage families to make use of our wraparound care which provides after-school supervision. If you wish to make use of this facility, please book online and in advance.

General rules reminder

As well as being fun, Times Tables Rockstar is a great way for children to cement their knowledge of times tables. Good knowledge of times tables is something which is invaluable for the children and benefits them greatly when solving problems in maths lessons.

Attendance & Punctuality

Our key priority in school is to promote good attendance and punctuality. This is because we want our pupils, in school, learning alongside classmates.

A figure of 90% means a child has missed an equivalent of 1 morning session of school every week.

A figure closer to 80% means a child has missed an equivalent to a day of school every week.

We understand, of course, there may be unavoidable and genuine reasons for absence. We do, however, want to work closely with families to ensure children are in school every day.

As a general reminder:

- Please make medical appointments outside of the school day or aim to minimise the amount of time your child will miss to attend the appointment;
- Only allow your child to stay at home in response to genuine illness;
- Do not take holidays during term time;
- Ensure your child arrives on time as lateness is recorded and will impact attendance figures.

If you have had an issue on a morning getting your child to school, we would always encourage you to contact us. We will help and it is always better to arrive later than not at all.

If you child seems unwell in the morning but appears much better by the afternoon, we encourage you to bring them in for the afternoon session.

We continue to stress, however, that pupils need to remain home for 48 hours after any incidents of vomiting or diarrhoea.

If there are any issues or concerns that are impacting school attendance, or punctuality, please contact the school office and an appointment will be made with one of the senior lead members of staff as advice and support can be given.

Our intention will always be to work with you, and support you, to ensure your child is able to attend.
