LISTEN TO THE WORD – 5th NOVEMBER 2023 – 31st SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Malachi 1: 14 – 2:2, 8-10 | Psalm 130 | 1 Thessalonians 2: 7-9, 13 | Matthew 23: 1-12

"Today let us honour God in humility, sincerity and truth."

The introduction to today's readings in the Missal speaks of how easy it is for human pride to falsify God's message. The sin of pride is one that we are all rather prone to; whether it is pride in ourselves or in others, it is so easy to move from the justifiable pride, when one accomplishes a difficult task, to that pride that comes from a false elevation of our own worth.

In the Old Testament the priesthood was granted to the descendants of the tribe of Levi. The priesthood was very powerful in the Jewish faith but with power comes responsibility and, in the reading from Malachi, we see that this power, through pride, has led to corruption. Instead of a priesthood lived out in humility the priests have turned away from God and become contemptible and vile in the eyes of the people. The passage is a warning from God to all those who have power over others; if you do not keep to God's ways the people will cry out to God and God will come to their aid.

In contrast Paul's Thessalonians are living in a community that recognises the worth of each individual and where pride in oneself cannot find a home. This way of life is a gift from God. Following the example of Paul and his companions the Thessalonians are living sincere, humble lives by recognising the basic goodness of everyone and this brings the whole community close through their shared love of God. A real lesson for today.

Matthew's Gospel focuses our thoughts on the dangers of false pride. He uses the faults of the scribes and the Pharisees to remind us that if we do not lead humble, sincere lives then we cannot see the truth of God's love for us. It is what we are on the inside that counts not the trappings we wear on the outside. When we allow the sin of pride to rule in our lives we, like the scribes and the Pharisees, turn away from God and turn towards the world. The world cannot save us; only faith in Jesus Christ can lead us to eternal life.
