Wilderness Outdoor Education

Communication

Communication with families is really important to us, and we want to ensure that everyone is receiving, and reading, messages in a timely manner. As you are aware, we use ARBOR to communicate with parents/carers. Message are sent either by the in-app message function or via email. We no longer send out text messages. To ensure that you get notified when we send out a new message via the app, we would encourage all parents/carers to **download the Parent App**.

The Parent App is the mobile version of the Parent Portal, for use on mobile devices such as smartphones and tablets. Parents can download the Parent App for free from either the Play store for Android phones or the App Store for IOS. If you do not have the Parent app you will only find out about a notification when you log into your child's ARBOR account.

Parents and Guardians have the same login and account details to the Parent App and the Parent Portal.

Family Hub – Stanley

The Family Hub offer support for families from pregnancy up until your child turns 19, or 25 if they have special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND). This includes help will all aspects of being a parent or carer, helping your child learn and develop and support for mental and physical health concerns.
