Breakfast Club

Continuing with the food theme, we have made a few changes to the way our breakfast club operates. Donna, our cook, is now taking responsibility for the cooking and Miss Glendenning and Miss McLellan are supervising the children who attend. We are now offering a hot option as well as toast and cereal.

- Monday beans on toast
- Tuesday sausage in bun
- Wednesday scrambled egg
- Thursday bacon in a bun
- Friday –pain au chocolate

There will a slight increase in the cost of breakfast club and this will rise to ± 3.50 per day from 01/05/2024. This is due to the wider menu available and increased staff.

These changes have been well received by our children, who seem delighted with the range of choices.

Recent Updates from Emblematic

- 1. Following some comments from customers regarding our independent Call Centre, we have decided to bring the call centre back in house so when you phone in with a question you will be dealing with a person who is at the same location as the factory and warehouse, this will greatly improve customer service during our busiest weeks in July and August.
- 2. Last year we have teamed up with a company called **Klarna**, to offer an **interest free 3payment plan** to help spread the costs of uniform over three equal payments thus reducing the strain and worries about uniform costs and following comments received last year we have lowered the minimum spend amount to help with you with spreading the costs.
- 3. Our website has been updated, which allows far more integration with our shops and will enable stock holding to be shown online in real time making it quicker to see if items are available straight away.
