The Boy at the back of the Class

Year 4 enjoyed a wonderful trip to the Theatre Royal this week to see a production of The Boy at the Back of the Class – their recent class novel - by Onjali Rauf.

The story focuses on Ahmet, a Syrian refugee who is struggling to adapt to his new life in London after his traumatic journey to England and the heartbreak he encountered. Rauf's book centres on the importance of friendship and encourages children not to fear those who are different. Ahmet's friends come up with a very clever plan to reunite him with his lost family.

As we were leaving the theatre and getting on our bus back to school, the actor playing the central character, came over to thank us for attending the show. What a lovely thing to do. We were quite starstruck!
